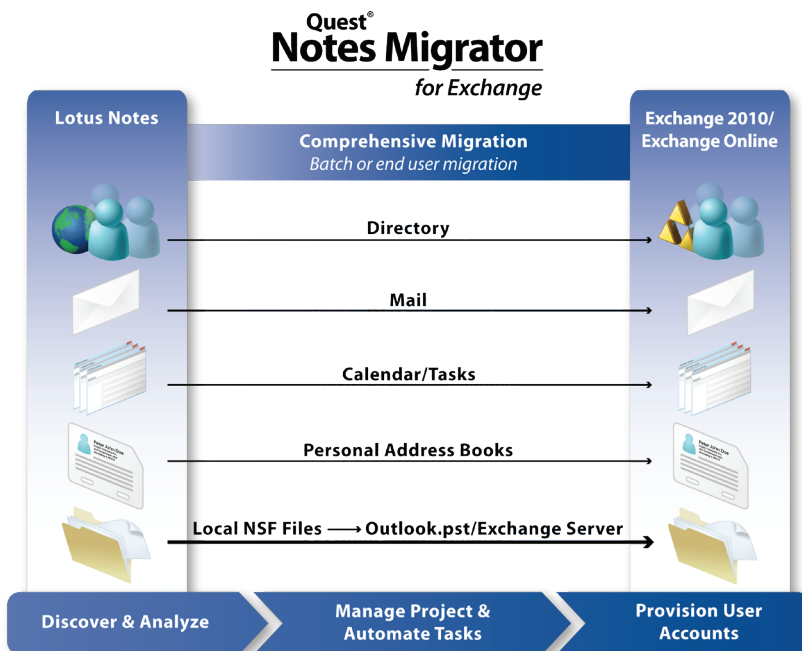
ZeroIMPACT™ Migration from Lotus Notes to Microsoft Exchange 2010 and Exchange Online

Many organizations today are migrating from Lotus Notes to Microsoft Exchange or Exchange Online. Some have already made significant investments in Microsoft software, servers and infrastructure and want to standardize on the Microsoft platform; others are transitioning to Exchange as part of a merger or acquisition. SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

On the Domino Server

- Lotus Domino version 4.6.x, 5.x, 6.x, 7.x, 8.0.0, 8.0.1 or 8.0.2

On the Exchange Server

- Exchange 2010, 2007 (SP0, SP1 or SP2) or Exchange 2003

On each Migration Machine(s)

- Workstation OS must be:
 - For migration to Exchange 2003: 32-bit version of Windows 2000, Windows XP SP2 or higher, or Windows Server 2003 or 2003 R2.
 - For migration to Exchange 2007 or 2010: 32-bit version of Windows XP SP2 or higher, Windows Server 2003 or 2003 R2, Windows 7, Windows Vista, or Windows Server 2008.
- Lotus Notes client version 5.0.11 to 7.0.1 (inclusive), or 8.0.0, 8.0.1 or 8.0.2
- Outlook 2002, 2003 or 2007 must be installed (Outlook 2003 or 2007 recommended)
- Required for migration to Exchange 2007 (only): Exchange 2007 or E2007 SP1 Management Tools (32-bit version), which in turn requires: .Net Framework 2.0, Microsoft Management Console (MMC), and Windows PowerShell.
- Required for any Exchange 2003 administrative functions (only):
 - Windows Admin Tools (adminpak.msi).
 - Exchange System Manager (version to match the installed version of Exchange)

SQL Server

- Access to SQL server 2000/2005 is required.
Note: SQL 2005 Express is included
